HOMEWORK POLICY

Feel overwhelmed? It's really not as bad as you think!

Homework is a review or extension of concepts taught in class. The homework should not take longer than 30-50 minutes. If you find that your child is consistently spending more time please contact the teacher. There are long-term and short-term assignments given. Long-term assignments will be accepted late with the grade being lowered each consecutive day by 10 points. On the 4th day it is a 0. Short-term assignments are due the following day. Parent notes, e-mail, or messages left on teacher's voice mail will be accepted for extenuating circumstances. The assignment will then be due the following day for no loss of points. Each grading period 2 late daily homework assignments will be accepted at a reduced grade. The 3rd and subsequent assignments will result in a grade of 0. This policy follows the 6th grade homework policy.

All class work and homework must be made up if a student has an excused absence.

If you are considering taking your child out of school other than for illness, you must obtain permission in advance from the administration for the absence to be excused.

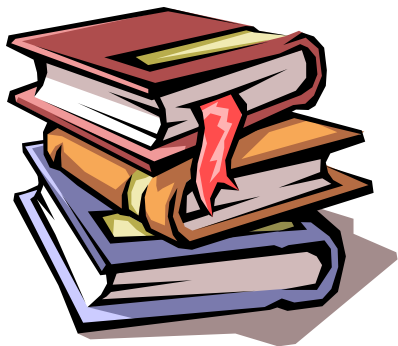
HOME ACTIVITY SUGGESTIONS:
