Third Grade Expectations

Literacy:

- Reading for comprehension and becoming familiar with various reading categories such as
 mystery, poetry, science fiction, biography, as well
 as culturally diverse selections with an emphasis
 on non-fiction reading
- Independent (silent) and oral reading
- Listening and responding to various readings
- The writing process of prewriting, drafting, revising, editing, and final copy
- Spelling, punctuation, parts of speech, correct language usage, and language expression
- Paragraphs organized around a topic sentence and main idea
- The five elements of fiction which are setting, plot, theme, character, and conflict.

Math:

- Regrouping with 4 and 5 digits
- Multiplication and division fact families
- Understanding of fractions
- Math patterns and formulas
- Graphing
- Geometry
- Time (analog clock), money and measurement

Social Studies

- Mapping skills
- Geography
- Communities around the world
- Introduction to <u>basic</u> US history

Science

- Plant Growth and Development
- Changes
- Land and Water

Homework:

- 30 minutes per night Monday through Thursday
- Work is due the next day
- 20 minutes of reading 5 nights per week
- Daily planners purchased from school to record assignments
