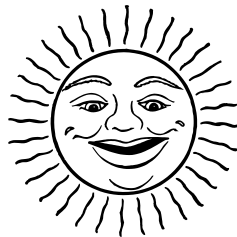


Homework Expectations

Your child will be assigned weekly homework to reinforce skills being taught in the classroom. Homework will always be a review on skills already learned. This will include nightly reading assignments as well as written assignments. Nightly homework is designed to help your child develop responsible learning habits and critical time management skills. Your support will ensure that your child gains maximum benefits from the homework assignments.

Fun Learning Activities for Home

- In a spiral notebook, have your child write about and illustrate some of their favorite activities
- Read, listen to, and discuss stories
- Visit the library regularly
- Write letters to friends and relatives
- Play learning games (like "Chutes and Ladders", "Hi Ho Cherry'O", and Concentration)
- Work jigsaw puzzles
- Learn new songs and rhymes



First Grade Supply List

- 6 glue sticks
- 2 large pink erasers
- 1 box of 24 crayons
- 1 pair of scissors
- 1 package 24 colored pencils
- 1 package broad markers
- 2 composition notebooks
- 1 pencil box
- 4 plain spiral notebooks (1 subject, wide-ruled; 1 blue, 1 yellow, 1 red, 1 green)
- 2 dozen yellow #2 pencils with erasers
- 2 boxes of 4 broad-tip, low odor **BLACK** dry-erase markers
- 1 white 1" 3-ring binder (hardback)

Curriculum Expectations

In the first grade, your child will continue to develop and expand the following reading and writing skills:

Reading:

- Ask and answer questions about key details
- Retell stories including: key details, demonstrate understanding of central message, describe characters, setting and major events
- Know and use various text features
- Identify reasons an author gives to support points in a text
- Recognize basic features of print (capitalization and punctuation)
- Demonstrate understanding of spoken words, syllables and sounds



Writing:

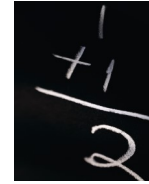
- Be introduced to the writing process through journals, writing prompts and letter writing
- Write opinion, informative/explanatory and narrative pieces
- Use upper and lowercase letters appropriately
- Participate in shared research projects
- Learn to recognize and write complete sentences
- Develop writing mechanics (capitalization and ending punctuation)



Your child will also study the following Math, Science, and Social Studies skills and concepts:

Math:

- Represent and solve problems involving addition and subtraction
- Work with addition and subtraction equations through 20
- Understand place value using tens and ones
- Use place value understanding to add and subtract
- Tell and write time to the hour and half-hour
- Measure lengths indirectly
- Represent and interpret data
- Reason with shapes and their attributes

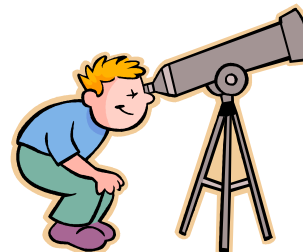


Science: Students learn to use their skills of observation, communication and problem-solving to explore the world of science through the topics:

Assessment Practices
